Maj. Richard T. Brady, U.S. Marine Corps is assigned as the AC/S Comptroller for the 3D Marine Division.

Maj. Brady earned a Bachelors of Science degree in International Business from Saint Louis University in 1993 and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Marine Corps through the PLC program. In 1994 Major Brady was designated a Financial Management Officer after completing The Basic School in Quantico VA. Following completion of the Financial Management Officer's course in Camp Lejeune, NC, Major Brady was assigned to 1st Supply Battalion, 1st FSSG, Camp Pendleton, CA where he served for three years as fiscal officer of the SASSY Management Unit and one year as Commanding Officer of H&S Co.

In 1998 Major Brady was ordered to Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, CA where in 1999 he earned a Master in Science degree in Financial Management and was subsequently assigned to HQMC. While at HQMC Major Brady served as the Investment Programs Development Officer, Programs and Resources from 2000 to 2002 after which he served as Aide-de-Camp to the Assistant Commandant of the Marine Corps. In 2003 he reported to Marine Corps Command and Staff College. Following completion of Command and Staff College in 2004, Major Brady received orders to 3D Marine Division.

During this tour, Major Brady has deployed to Indonesia in support of tsunami relief operations, to the Republic of the Philippines in support of mudslide relief operations, and to the Multi-National Corps-Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Major Brady is a Certified Defense Financial Manager (CDFM) and a Certified Government Financial Manager (CGFM).

Jacqueline P. "Jacque" Daniels is a member of the Comptroller Division, Marine Corps Base Camp Butler, Okinawa. As the Internal Review Officer, she exercises full administrative and technical responsibility for the Resource Evaluation and Analysis Branch.

Jacque began her career as an Air Force financial management specialist at Dyess Air Force Base, Texas. She served as budget analyst at Clark Air Base, Republic of the Philippines from 1985 to 1989 and was honorably discharged from the Air Force in 1990. During the next 12 years, she joined the Air Force Audit Agency and served as staff auditor and supervisory auditor. She also performed cost analysis for commercial space launches at Patrick Air Force Base Florida from 1997 to 1998. Prior to her current assignment, she served as supervisory auditor (team leader), for the Pacific Area Audit Office, Team B Kadena. Jacque also served on the Air Force Audit Agency Diversity Committee.

Mr. Wayne Ingle assumed the position as the Director of the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) Japan in July 2000. He is responsible for providing accounting and finance support to the four military services and DoD activities located throughout Japan and the western Pacific.

Ingle entered Civil Service on 28 October 1985 as a Supervisory Military Pay Examiner at the United States Army Finance and Accounting Center (USAFAC). During the first five years as a civilian employee in USAFAC, he served as Assistant Chief, Claims and Collections Division; a Systems Accountant in the Active Army Pay, Policy and Systems Division; a Supervisory Systems Accountant (Division Chief) in the Reserve Components Pay, Policy, and Systems Division, and as Supervisory Systems Accountant (Deputy Director), Centralized Pay Operations. Ingle's first civilian overseas assignment was as the Deputy Finance and Accounting Officer at Camp Zama, Japan. He served in that position from November 1990 through October 1991. He was then selected as Principal Assistant to the Commander, 175th Theater Finance Command (FINCOM), Korea, where he served until September 1994. In 1994 he returned to Camp Zama and served as the Finance and Accounting Officer through September 1997. At the end of this tour he returned to Korea again as the Principal Assistant to the Commander, 175th FINCOM where he served until July 2000.

Ingle graduated from the University of Maryland, Summa Cum Laude, Phi Kappa Phi, with a Bachelor of Science in Psychology. He later studied Accounting and Information Management at Indiana and Vincennes Universities. Ingle graduated from Michigan State University with a Master of Arts in Education (Mathematics and Science). He is a graduate of Personnel Management for Executives I and II, and the Army Management Staff College. Ingle is also a Certified Government Financial Manager.

Ingle is a Life Member of the Finance Corps Association, Non Commissioned Officers Association, Association of the United States Army, Michigan State Alumni Association, The American Legion, and The Veterans of Foreign Wars. He is also a member of Association of Government Accountants and the American Society of Military Comptrollers.

In April 1985, Ingle retired from the active Army as a Command Sergeant Major. He is a graduate of the Finance Noncommissioned Officer Advance Course and the Sergeants Major Academy. While on active duty Ingle served overseas tours in Turkey, Japan, Okinawa (3), Korea (2), and Vietnam. His active duty awards include the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (30LC), the Purple Heart, the Army Commendation Medal (30LC), and the Army Achievement Medal.
